Rationale

Pupil Premium is funding allocated to schools for children who have been eligible for free school meals (FSM) at some point in the last 6 years (Ever-6) and children who have been looked after (LAC) continuously for more than 6 months. The Government introduced this additional funding to address underlying inequalities between non-FSM and children who are in lower income families. As a group, children eligible for free school meals have lower educational attainment than their peers. This funding enables schools to provide extra support to these disadvantaged groups, targeting pupils who need it most helping to reduce the attainment gap.

Success criteria

The school's actions secure improvement in disadvantaged pupils' progress, so that the gaps between disadvantaged pupils and other pupils in school are reduced, specifically by the end of year 2 and year 6. That the disadvantaged pupils in school outperform disadvantaged nationally and are in line with other pupils nationally.

Pupil Premium Grant spend in 2017/18

In 2017/18 the Pupil Premium Grant was used to fund or contribute to the following:

Personal development, behaviour and welfare:

- Pastoral Officer Contribution towards employment of Pastoral Officer with a key focus on pupil attendance, support for parents and families and multi-agency coordination and referral.
- Commando Joe Contribution towards the intervention and support to improve behaviour, attitudes and character to build pupil self-esteem and a positive, aspirational attitude towards learning.
- Access to Multi Agency Early Help A range of services, including counselling support and family support, are employed to provide bespoke one-to-one assistance.


Teaching, learning and assessment:

- Staffing High level of teaching support to provide targeted provision to disadvantaged pupils. This includes one-to-one programmes and bespoke intervention programmes.
- CPD for teachers and teaching assistants with a particular focus on Writing and Maths.
- Speech and Language Speech and Language Therapy Assistant to enable regular, one-to-one speech and language support for pupils.

Curriculum enrichment:


- Visits and Events Visits are subsidised to ensure pupils in receipt of the PP can enjoy a wide range of educational
 experiences.
- Wider learning Peer Supporters; Digital Ambassadors and Xplore Play Leaders are all programmes provided by 'Wider Learning' that train groups of pupils to be able to take on additional responsibilities. A contribution is made towards these programmes.
- Writing development A range of resources have been purchased to enhance writing opportunities throughout school both indoors and outdoors to rasie the profile of writing and to provide purpose.
- Reading development A range of books have been purchased to further enhance quality books for children to access
 at school and home

Impact of Pupil Premium 2017/18



In the Year 1 Phoncs Screening Check, 76% of disadvatged pupils met the expected standard which is above disadvantaged pupils nationally.

In Key Stage 1, there was a significant improvement in the proportion of disadvantaged pupils attaining the expected standard in Reading (23%), Writing (31%) and Maths (23%) when compared to 2017 outcomes. The proportion was also above 'others' both in school and nationally.



The gap between disadvantaged pupils and others has narrowed significantly in reading by 22% and in writing and maths disadvantaged pupils now outperform 'others.'

In Key Stage 2, there was a significant improvement in the proportion of disadvantaged pupils attaining the expected standard in reading (23%) and maths (27%) when compared to 2017 outcomes. The proportion was also above 'others' nationally. Although there was a slight dip in the proportion of pupils meeting the expected standard in writing, the progress of disadvantaged pupils was in line with national.

The progress of disadvanted pupils in reading and maths was above disadvantaged pupils and 'others' nationally.
