

Sports Premium Grant Report: 2016/17

The PE and sport premium is designed to help primary schools make additional and sustainable improvements to the provision of PE and sport activities for the benefit of all pupils to encourage the development of healthy, active lifestyles. £8,000 is received by each school, plus an additional £5 per pupil in years 1 to 6.

At St. Martin's, children have access to a wide ranging PE curriculum and a range of sports based extra-curricular clubs. From an early age competitive sport is nurtured and encouraged as we work with PASS Wolverhampton (Partnerships and School Sport) and WASPS (Wolverhampton Association for Sport in Primary Schools). Tournaments are also organised across the schools in the Multi Academy Trust to enhance the opportunities for pupils to take part in competitions. A coherent programme of study is designed to provide pupils with a variety of opportunities to improve their knowledge and skills. Investment from the sports premium goes into some sports equipment to ensure a greater variety of PE that the school already offer, and to ensure that appropriate staff training is in place.

Skills are taught through P.E. lessons and through a variety of sports provision offered after school both through specialists and school staff. There are teams that are run (for example football and netball) throughout the year, that take part in competitions and leagues. There are also 'one-off' tournaments that pupils take part in (for example gymnastics, dodgeball and athletics) to enable a range of opportunities throughout the school year. As well as this, there are locally arranged events to encourage children to enjoy sports and physical activities with pupils from other schools (for example dance and multi-sports).

A TLR has been appointed to lead and develop PE provision across the Multi Academy Trust. This is to ensure there is a consistent approach to the skills that are taught during PE sessions and that staff are confident and appropriately trained to teach these.

Active Leaders Training	Specific training, provided by Wider Learning, enables pupils in Y5 and Y6 to lead fitness activities for younger children.	£700

In **2017/18** the focus will be on further raising the profile of sports and PE across the school and to provide an even greater range of extra-curricular activities. There will be further investment in the professional development of staff. Another area for development in 2017/18 will be to improve the systems in place that are used to assess pupils' progress in PE and to monitor and record the impact of the PE and Sports Premium funding.
