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Information

This year the children will be issued with a learning journal. This will help them to prepare, complete and consolidate their learning. Tasks will be provided on a Monday and will have specified dates to be returned. This may include:

- Reading an extract in relation to their Thematic or Science topic. This may be something they have not seen before in preparation for the lesson or it may be pieces of work to consolidate their understanding.
- Maths questions that require children to use the methods they have been taught in school. This may be arithmetic based or reasoning style questions.
- English homework will also be given which may include a task to complete or a Spelling, Punctuation or Grammar focus.
- Spellings. Your child will be given a list of words to learn that week in preparation for a spelling test on the following Friday. We would encourage you to help your child with the practising of these words. If your child is struggling with the spelling of certain high frequency words, they will be given a list of these words to bring home.
- Handwriting. Occasionally, your child will be given a handwriting exercise to complete at home in order to improve the presentation of their work.

English

In English this term, Year 6 will be reading 'The Boy in the Striped Pyjamas'. This will relate to their thematic topic this term and will have excellent cross-curricular links.

The children will use a range of related texts, varying in genre to expose them to a variety of text types. This will help prepare them for the different texts that can appear on a SAT paper.

We will also be focusing on improving our writing skills including varying our sentence types and writing for a range of audiences and purposes. Children will develop their use of a range of punctuation and be able to apply this to their written work.

As well as this, children will be focusing on improving their spellings. This will be done in class but also as part of homework tasks. Please ensure these are being practised at home.


Thematic topic

This term in our thematic lessons we will be learning all about World War II. The children will engage in exciting History lessons whereby they will develop their historical enquiry and interpretation skills, whilst also developing a sense of chronology. We will look at a variety of aspects including:

- How the war started.
- Which countries were involved.
- Key Leaders.
- The importance of evacuation.
- The Blitz
- Propaganda.

Science

In Science, the children will identify and label the different parts of the human heart and each of their functions. We will also look at how water and nutrients transport through the human body using the different parts of the digestive system. We will also focus on the importance of diet and exercise to maintain a healthy lifestyle.



Maths

During this term, in Arithmetic we will continue to work on the four operations, developing and consolidating methods of addition, subtraction, division and multiplication. We will apply these methods to calculating with decimals and will focus on how these can apply to reasoning type questions. In addition to this, we will begin to calculate with vulgar fractions.

In Data and Measure, we will focus on interpreting and drawing pie charts. We will also look at using measurements to solve reasoning questions including km, ml, l, g and kg.

During reasoning lessons, children will apply all of their skills to a range of question types. This includes using a variety of averages, algebraic equations and applying taught knowledge to reasoning style questions.

Don't Forget...

- We will have PE on Wednesday afternoons (6AT). Children must come to school in their PE kit.
- Don't forget to put your child's name on any personal belongings to help them not to lose anything.
- Learning Journals will help children during lessons as well as consolidate any prior learning. It is important that these tasks are done in order to support your child during class. Please help with these tasks when necessary.

RE

In RE lessons, we will be looking at Gospels and the importance of thinking about what Jesus would do. We will also be looking at how different people express their faith through a range of ways, including the arts.
