Spare Clothes

Sometimes our children will have toileting accidents at school or get a bit wet when they are playing in the water. We would appreciate it if the children could keep a bag on their peg with spare pants, trousers and socks so that if they are wet we can change them. You can leave this bag at school if you wish to. Also please ensure your child's name is on all items of clothing.

Outdoor Play

We will go out to play in most weather and it is important that the children are appropriately dressed. In the wet weather please feel free to bring wellies to school and we will put them on when we go outside. The children will always need a waterproof coat in school and a hat and gloves in the cold weather.

Snack Time

The children will be given a snack and drink at school every day. This is always a piece of fruit or a vegetable and water or milk. We ask that the children do not bring any other snacks or drinks to school so all children in Nursery have the same.

Muddy Mondays

Every Monday (starting 28th September) we will be going to explore our forest areas. Muddy Mondays will happen in all weathers unless it is raining heavily or extremely cold. The children will need warm clothes on a Monday with wellies, a warm coat and gloves. It would be helpful if you could send a spare change of clothes with your children in case they get muddy.


Welcome to Nursery!

During the first half term in Nursery we spend time supporting children in adjusting to the daily routine and making relationships with adults and other children. We understand that for some children this is a big change, especially when they have never been to another Nursery before or have been off for a prolonged period of time. After your child arrives at the gate we have circle time each morning, themed activities around the room, snack, outdoor play, a group activity and story time every day.

Our theme for this term is 'All About Me!' We have listed the topics and themes we will explore each week below and suggested some ways you can support your child at home. We value your support at home and would love to see some photographs or pictures you and your child have made, which can be emailed through to the office.

7th September Starting Nursery

'I'm absolutely too small for school' by Lauren Child. This week we will be getting to know the routines in Nursery and meeting new friends. At home ask your child about what they have done or who they have met.



14th to 21st September My Family and Me

Over these two weeks we will be thinking about all the ways we are similar and different to our friends, as well as telling our friends about our families. It would be helpful if you could email a photograph of your child and their family in to share.

28th September to 5th October Autumn

Over these two weeks we will be thinking about the changes that happen during Autumn to the world around us and to the weather! At home you could collect different coloured leaves to make a drawing or go for nature walks.

12th October 100 Decker Bus

This week will be reading the book 100 Decker Bus. We will be learning about different forms of transport on land, in the sea and in the sky. We will also be talking about how we get to school.

19th October Celebrations

This week we will be thinking about the different celebrations our families celebrate. At home look at some old photographs of your families celebrations, draw a picture of your family celebrating. As it is Diwali you could make a Mendhi pattern by drawing around a hand and decorating it.



2nd November Colours

This week we will be learning all about colours, and finding colours in our environment. To celebrate Bonfire Night we will be looking at all the different colours of fireworks. At home you could experiment what happens when we mix certain colours?

9th November My emotions

During this week we will be learning about our different emotions, using the story The Colour Monster. We will be talking about how to identify our emotions and what we can do to control them. At home, you could talk about what makes us sad or happy.

16th November World Nursery Rhyme Week

This week will be learning lots of new and old nursery rhymes, finishing the week by creating our own Nursery Rhyme! At home you could sing a Nursery Rhyme or talk about the characters.

23rd November to 4th December My Body

This week we will be learning all about our bodies, from the features on our face to the tips of our toes! We will also have a week of senses, where we will focus on one sense a day. At home you could try a new food, or make shadow puppets on the wall.

7th to 16th December Christmas

Over these two weeks we will be talking about how we celebrate Christmas. At home write some Christmas cards with your child and get them to give post them to your family or friends. Look for different Christmas decorations when you are
